1	Whom did Moses and Aaron go to see after they talked to the elders of Israel? Moses and Aaron went to see (Ex. 5:1)
2	What was Pharaoh's response when Moses and Aaron told him about the Lord's command to let the people of Israel go? Why? Pharaoh said, "!" (opposite of "yes"), because he didn't know this Lord was and, therefore, had no reason to obey Him. (Ex. 5:2)
	Pharaoh didn't know who the Lord is, but he would soon find out! All people will one day.
